### Additional Course Costs

<p>Equipment/materials needed</p>	<p>In addition to the essential equipment listed below, there will also be an ongoing need to purchase paper, model making materials and some construction materials as well as to print drawings and photographs for the various set studio projects. You will find that many materials and printing facilities are available to you on campus at highly competitive prices and that the local art supply shops offer student discounts. However, even with this in mind, it is wise to budget approximately £500 for costs in these areas over the course in the coming year. <p>Equipment/materials recommended</p>	<p>During the three years of the course you will need, and want, to purchase digital equipment. We advise that, for the moment, you don't purchase expensive computer equipment until you've received our recommendations for the specification of hardware and software. However, if you have done so already, do bring whatever you have to Canterbury. Similarly, bring with you any other art and drafting materials that you already have.</p>
<p>Visits</p>	<p>In the second term we run a study trip. You will find that some of the urban spaces, buildings and exhibitions that we see on this relate both to your design projects and essays and we hope that you will find the trip inspirational. We will provide further details of the itinerary, the costs and the ways in which the trip is to be arranged later in the first term. In previous years, trips have been to Rome, Vienna, Berlin and Paris. Field trips inside the UK are sometimes free, but you are likely to be expected to pay the cost of travel associated with these field trips, such as travelling to London for an exhibition for example.</p>
