| Equipment/materials needed                 | <p>The University is equipped with a wide range of digital media suites and computer labs at the Canterbury campus, however as the course is predominantly digital in nature, a good quality, portable laptop computer will be required for working at home and while off site. Almost all the software you will use on the course is cross platform, so either a Windows or Mac laptop will be fine. Students wishing to use Linux based laptops should be aware that not all of the software used on the course is compatible.</p> <p>The course team produce a yearly updated “suggested spec” guide which you should refer to regarding minimum and suggested system requirements for new laptop purchases. This guide aims to strike a sensible balance between performance, longevity and cost.</p> <p>As a rough estimate, it is worth budgeting between £800 - £1200 for a Laptop and accessories.</p> |
| Equipment/materials recommended            | <p>Throughout the three years of the course you will develop a broad skill set in “making” and “tooling”, which naturally will result in you wanting to purchase tools and instruments to aid in this.</p> <p>A spec sheet of appropriate and recommended equipment is published yearly, and is subject to change, however we suggest that you budget approximately £400 for tools, materials and printing each year.</p>  |
