Additional Course Costs

<p>Equipment/materials needed</p>	<p>The University is equipped with a wide range of digital media suites and computer labs at the Canterbury campus, however as the course is quite digital in nature, a good quality, portable laptop computer will be required for working at home and while off site. Almost all the software you will use on the course is cross platform, so either a Windows or Mac laptop will be fine.</p> <p>The course team produce a yearly updated “suggested spec” guide which you should refer to regarding minimum and suggested system requirements for new laptop purchases. This guide aims to strike a sensible balance between performance, longevity and cost.</p> <p>As a rough estimate, it is worth budgeting between £600 - £1200 for a Laptop and accessories.</p>
<p>Equipment/materials recommended</p>	<p>During the three years of the course you will need, and want, to purchase sketching, model making and fabrication materials. It is suggested that you begin the course with a basic set of pencils, pens, sketchbooks (A4 and A5), as well as a USB stick and a small tool box to store and transport your art supplies.</p> <p>You will be engaging with “making” at various scales and stages throughout the course, as such, we suggest you budget approximately £400 for materials and printing each year.</p>
<p>Visits</p>	<p>Field trips within the UK are sometimes free, but you are likely to be expected to pay the cost of travel associated with these trips, such as travelling to London for an exhibition or event. In the second and third year of the course we may undertake international study trips, which have variable costs depending on the destination, but budgeting around £350 for would be reasonable.</p>
