Equipment/materials needed	<p>Here is a list of equipment that is recommended for students when they join the course in September:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Range of Pencils from 6B to H- Pencil Sharpener- Soft & Hard Rubber- Craft/Stanley Knife- Scalpel- Pritt Stick- Sketch Books – A4 or A3 (buy as required)- A 30cm Steel Ruler- Masking Tape- Fine Liner Pens – various thicknesses- Spray Mount (for final presentation of work)- USB/Hard drive 2 GB- A good stock of magazine tears <p>You might find it useful to have your own laptop – the vast majority of the time we use Macs – and if you can, ensure it is equipped with Adobe Creative Suite which you can receive discount on once you have enrolled. This is not essential as you will have access to computers on campus, but might help you in terms of self-directed study. Should you be required to provide any of your own equipment throughout the duration of the course, we will let you know in advance.</p> <p>If you wish to purchase a Mac, please be aware of the following specification suggestions:</p> <p>MacBook, MacBook Air or MacBook Pro Laptop Please Note: If buying a MacBook Air Laptop, at the time of purchase upgrade the RAM from 4GB to 8GB (As this cannot currently be done retrospectively, and is essential for supporting the range of software that will be used on the course)</p>

Equipment/materials recommended	<p>These items are things which you may need, depending on your approach to work and on the projects you choose to pursue. Select some to purchase initially, and build up as and when you need other things:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Own domestic colour printer- Selection of papers/materials- SD card
Visits	<p>Field trips inside the UK are sometimes free, but you are expected to pay your own travel costs such as the cost of travelling to London for an exhibition for example. Research trips to London should happen on a weekly basis so please consider the cost implications of this and check thetrainline.com to find out costs. In the past, the course has made overseas study trips. They are not compulsory but there is a charge for students to join. To give you an idea of costs, a trip to Copenhagen cost around £300 for travel and hotel based on 30 students travelling.</p>
