

Additional Course Costs

<p>MA Fashion Photography Rochester</p>	
<p>Equipment/materials needed</p>	<p>Though photography has a 'network' shared folder, students are advised to take responsibility for the safe storage of their work. In order to do this you will need to download, store and transport relevant course work. Students should purchase a 'USB Memory stick (32Gb+)' and an 'USB3 and/or Thunderbolt Hard Drive' (1TB or above).</p> <p>Students joining the programme are advised to set aside at least £200 a year for the purchase of colour and black and white film and paper materials for analogue and/or digital printing processes. Staff will advise you of the specific accessories, film and photographic paper that you will need for your initial projects.</p>
<p>Equipment/materials recommended</p>	<p>The University has computing resources which you will be able to access throughout your time at UCA. However, if you are considering purchasing a computer, our industry primarily works with Apple Macintosh computers. In this instance Apple MacBook Pro laptops are used extensively for field-work. We would advise that you delay any purchase until you are enrolled because once you are registered as a current student you will then be entitled to further discounts. Staff will be able to give more detailed advice at the beginning of term if you are unsure about what to buy.</p> <p>Within the department, students have access to the photography stores. The facility not only acts as a centre for the loan of specialist photographic equipment (at no charge), it also has a small shop for students to purchase essential photographic materials.</p> <p>For exhibitions throughout the course and final graduate shows material expenses will arise that will vary according to the student projects.</p>
<p>Visits</p>	<p>In the past, the course has made overseas trips. These trips are not mandatory but there is a charge for students to participate which varies according to length and destination. For field trips inside the UK you are likely to be expected to pay associated travel costs, such as for travelling to London for an exhibition for example or going on location for workshops. Visits to galleries, and exhibitions can take place as part of a unit of study, or for a year group. Advance notice would be given of any associated costs. Student are also encouraged to see exhibitions and events relevant to their studies in their own time.</p>
